

ORANGE COUNTY RECOVERY OVERVIEW

Section 1: How Much Stimulus Money is Orange County Receiving? (recovery.ny.gov)

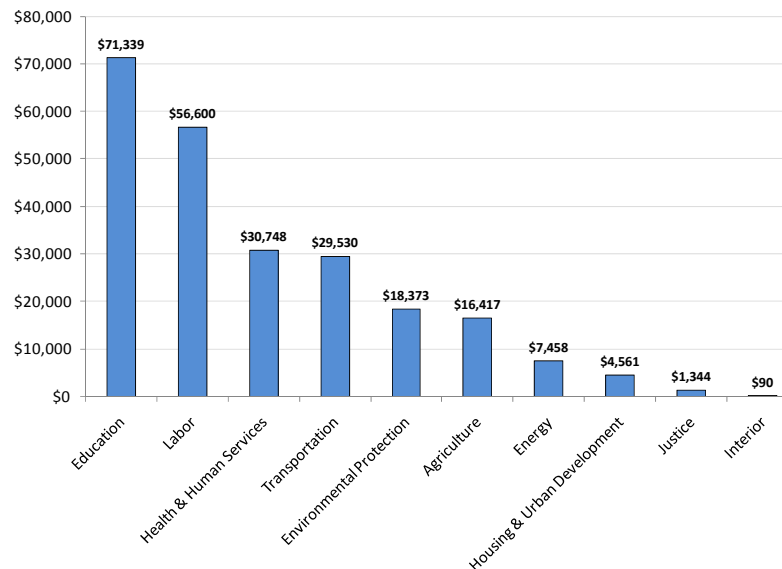
As of May 10, 2010, New York State estimates that \$29.4 billion worth of Recovery investment will flow into the State during the busiest two years of Recovery Act spending. Of this, nearly \$236.5 million is expected to flow to targets within Orange County.

- The \$236.5 million expected in Orange County is being invested in the following areas:
 - \$77 million (33%) to individuals as food stamps, unemployment benefits, and Pell grants.
 - \$91 million (38.5%) to stabilize local government and school district budgets.
 - \$51.6 million (22%) to public infrastructure projects, a significantly higher share of the allotment than the state overall (7%).
 - \$15.9 million (7%) to other investments, such as homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing.
- The federal agencies that are expected to send the most money to Orange County include: Education (\$71 million), Labor (\$56.6 million), and Health and Human Services (\$30.7 million).

Chart 1. Major Recovery Investment in Orange Co. by Federal Agency (\$ thousands)



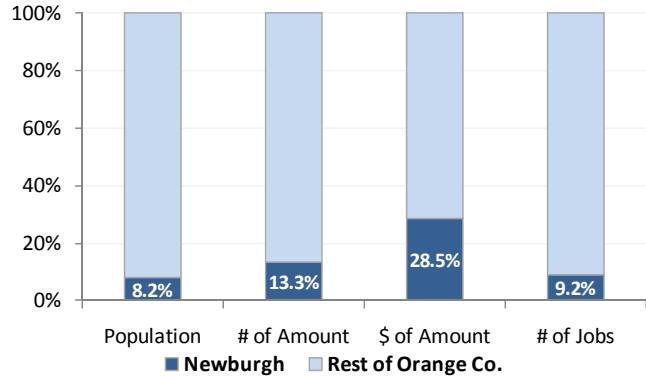
Section 2: Where are Recovery Investments and Jobs Going in Orange County? (recovery.gov)

As of June 30, 2010, approximately \$42 million of the \$236 million expected to flow to Orange County had been accounted for by local recipients through the Federal transparency website known as Recovery.gov (*see maps*).¹

The reporting on Recovery.gov shows that:

- Recipients in Newburgh have reported creating 6 jobs, or 9% of the 66 jobs reported in all of Orange County.
- Of the \$42 million that came into Orange County, \$12 million (or 28.5%) went to Newburgh.
- 188 recipients reporting to Recovery.gov from Orange County, of which 25 (or 13%) are based in Newburgh.

Section 3: Are Businesses Owned by People of Color Winning Recovery Contracts? (fpds.gov)

In addition to the investments received and distributed by the State of New York, Federal agencies have directly awarded 38 contracts throughout Orange County as of July 8, 2010, worth a total of \$24 million. Of those:

- Businesses owned by Native Americans received the largest number of contracts (14 of 38, or 37%); and,
- White-owned businesses received the largest share of the value of contracts, receiving \$14.7 million, or 61% of the overall value.

¹ While Recovery.gov data provides historic levels of detail about the # of jobs created & retained, the demographics of workers and the precise locations of work remain unknown. Often, the address used for these job numbers corresponds to the corporate address of the recipient agency or company, not the actual location of the work or the worker(s).
